This Week's BIG IDEA: As Christians, we are able to accept each other because Christ has accepted us and in doing so has bridged all former divisions with love. Diversity in the church honours God because it reveals how the Holy Spirit alone is able to bridge boundaries with love, which the wider society cannot solve through training and developing ideological stances.

- 3) Do you think God is honoured more in a diverse church than in a mono-church (Where most people sound, look and are from a similar background to me)? Why?
- 4) In what way are we to receive one another? (Romans 15:7)
- 5) The goal of unity is that believers would "together with one voice glorify" God (v.
- 6). What does this phrase describe? What might this mean for today?
